**What are autoclaves used in the medical applications to perform?** Autoclaves are commonly used in healthcare settings to sterilize medical devices. The items to be sterilized are placed inside a pressure vessel, commonly referred to as the chamber. Three factors are critical to ensuring successful steam sterilization in an autoclave: time, temperature and steam quality.

**What should be autoclaved in a lab?** Autoclaves may be used to sterilize equipment/products prior to use in an experiment or to render items non-infectious prior to disposal. The University of Iowa's Biohazard Waste Guidelines states that cultures, plates, and vials containing pathogenic organisms must be autoclaved prior to disposal.

**What cannot be sterilized in an autoclave?**

**How long does autoclave sterilization last?** It depends entirely on how items are packaged after sterilization. Generally speaking, items should be re-sterilized after each use, but items packaged in double-wrap linen packs or an inner layer of paper and outer layer of plastic have been proven to remain sterile for up to 96 weeks.

**Which form of sterilization is most commonly used in hospitals?** In hospitals and laboratories where reusable materials are frequently used, steam sterilization is predominantly used. It is also widely used in decontamination of infectious waste materials.

**Do hospitals still use autoclaves?** Hospitals still, in fact, use autoclaves for sterilisation. In fact, autoclaves and steam sterilisation are the standards for proper hospital equipment decontamination in many hospitals.

**What is the difference between N type and B type autoclave?** Class B autoclaves utilize a vacuum pump to completely remove air from the chamber, which enables steam to better penetrate the load. Class N autoclaves use steam from a boiler or generator to create downward displacement, which pushes air out of the chamber.

**Do autoclaves sterilize or disinfect?** An autoclave is used in medical and laboratory settings to sterilize lab equipment and waste. Autoclave sterilization works by using heat to kill microorganisms

such as bacteria and spores. The heat is delivered by pressurized steam.

**Why is 121 degrees used in autoclaves?** As per the concept used in an autoclave, at a pressure of 15 psi or 775 mm of Hg, the water boils at 121 degrees Celsius. If this steam comes into contact with surfaces, the latent heat generated kills microorganisms. Condensed liquids guarantee that the vast majority of bacteria are eliminated.

**Which autoclave is used in microbiology?** Sterilization autoclaves are widely used in microbiology and mycology, medicine and prosthetics fabrication, tattooing and body piercing, and funerary practice. They vary in size and function depending on the media to be sterilized and are sometimes called retort in the chemical and food industries.

**What are the two types of autoclave used in the laboratory?** The two most common types of steam sterilizers are gravity displacement autoclaves and high-speed prevacuum autoclaves.

**Which item should never be autoclaved?** Important: Do not autoclave items containing corrosives, solvents, volatiles, or radioactive materials.

**What type of sterilization uses an autoclave?** The basic principle of steam sterilization, as accomplished in an autoclave, is to expose each item to direct steam contact at the required temperature and pressure for the specified time. Thus, there are four parameters of steam sterilization: steam, pressure, temperature, and time.

**What is the principle behind the use of autoclave?** An autoclave is a device that works on the principle of moist heat sterilisation, wherein saturated steam is generated under pressure in order to kill microorganisms such as bacteria, viruses, and even heat-resistant endospores from various types of instruments.

**What is an autoclave for medical waste treatment?** Autoclaves are effective for treating many types of biological waste. Temperatures in these machines typically range from 250 to 325 degrees Fahrenheit, and this is sufficient for most types of regulated medical waste.

**What are the tools of classical education?** These three basic tools of learning (Grammar, Logic and Rhetoric) were called the Trivium. The Trivium is the heart of classical education. These tools of learning, not mere “subjects”, were forged and mastered. Subjects were the material upon which one practiced and developed these tools of learning.

**Which tool is used for online teaching?** Google Classroom is a free educational tool that enables teachers to hold online classes, invite students, assign homework, discuss tasks, and track student progress.

**What are the classical methods of teaching?** The classical approach has the worthy overall goal of teaching children to think for themselves. Using the “trivium” model, children move through three main stages of learning: concrete learning (the grammar stage), critical learning (the logic stage), and abstract learning (the rhetoric stage).

**What is the classical teaching style?** Classical education advocates believe that the mind must first be given facts (grammar), then provided with the means to think logically about them (logic), and finally supplied with the tools to express their own thoughts and conclusions (rhetoric).

**What is a digital teaching tool?** An online learning tool is any website, program, or application that can be accessed via the internet and will enhance teaching and learning. Digital learning tools can assist teachers and students with teaching, learning, and communication.

## **How to capture business requirements in Agile?**

**How does an Agile approach help software developers to capture and define the user requirements effectively?** Agile requirements management is focused heavily on action. With agile, you create a flexible framework upfront, so product implementation is faster and more accurate. In contrast, other approaches, such as the waterfall approach, have less flexibility and are built on a rigid

foundation.

### **How do you track requirements in Agile?**

**What is the Agile method of requirement analysis?** Agile Requirement Analysis in the context of custom software development is an approach that aligns with the principles of Agile methodology. Agile emphasizes flexibility, collaboration, and responsiveness to change throughout the software development process.

**How are requirements captured in Scrum?** In Scrum, requirements are gathered collaboratively through interactions between the Product Owner, development team, and stakeholders.

**How do you ensure that project requirements are captured and managed effectively in an agile environment?** This process involves collecting and analyzing stakeholders' requirements, documenting them in a Requirements Management Plan (RMP), evaluating the impact of changes in those requirements, and ensuring that the right stakeholders are involved in decision-making throughout the project.

### **How to handle new requirements in Agile?**

**Who collects requirements in Agile?** In Agile, requirements are shared among customer and business analyst, product owner, scrum master, designer, development team. Usually, the team is responsible for choosing a technical approach based on high-level requirements and implementing more detailed statements or acceptance criteria in user stories.

**Who writes requirements in Agile?** Project managers, team leaders and other business professionals who use agile project management systems set requirements to identify what elements the consumer of a product needs.

**What are the steps for requirements elicitation in Agile?** Using agile methods for requirements elicitation is crucial for project flexibility and responsiveness. Key steps include Engaging stakeholders, creating user stories, prioritizing based on importance, using epics/themes, visualizing via story mapping, and creating prototypes.

**How do you capture functional requirements in Agile?** There are two approaches for capturing functional requirements: User stories and epics, and use cases. They can be used together.

**What do requirements look like in Agile?** Ideally, Agile requirements are in the form of User Stories rather than "the system shall..." statements. And as such, they may create some ambiguity with respect to what they solution to the user story should do.

**How does an Agile maintain requirements?** Agile teams use various methods such as user stories, constant testing, and regular communication with stakeholders to keep track of changing requirements and provide products that match the customer's requirements. Poorly maintained requirements are a significant reason for project failure and rework.

**How are business requirements captured in Agile?** The User Story format has become the most popular way of expressing requirements in Agile for a number of reasons: It focuses on the viewpoint of a role who will use or be impacted by the solution. It defines the requirement in language that has meaning for that role.

**Who write user stories in Agile?** Working with user stories Generally a story is written by the product owner, product manager, or program manager and submitted for review. During a sprint or iteration planning meeting, the team decides what stories they'll tackle that sprint.

**How do you collect user requirements?** Gathering user requirements effectively involves defining clear objectives, identifying stakeholders, and using diverse techniques such as interviews and workshops. Ask open-ended questions to elicit detailed input, prioritize requirements, and document them consistently.

**What are four categories of business requirements?** In our approach, we start off by defining four fundamental categories (perspectives) of the solution that requirements have to address: Functional, Informational, Behavioral, and Environmental. Each of these four perspectives needs to be definable in both business requirements and system specifications.

**What are the techniques for gathering requirements?** Various techniques can be employed for this, such as surveys, questionnaires, interviews, one-on-one meetings, user stories, brainstorming sessions, process diagramming, follow-up meetings, and workshops. The goal is to collect data from the right people and prepare documents based on these gathered requirements.

**How long does it take to learn JSP and Servlet?** Learn Servlets in 3-4 hours. Focus on only the fundamentals (usually asked in interviews). Approach is more on practicals and lab sessions (theory is there to understand concepts). **What should I learn first, JSP or servlet?** The basic difference between servlets and jsp is that in servlets you embed html code inside java code whereas in jsp you write java code inside html. I'll suggest you to learn servlets first wherein you have two separate files, one for front-end and the server side file.

**Is JSP easy to learn?** JSP is considered an easy-to-learn application and is often the preferred technology when developing websites and other web applications. Typical advantages of JSP for web developers include these: Easy access to standard objects and actions when coding. Code does not require translation between operating systems.



**Why not to use JSP?** The common argument is that JSP leads to messy, undisciplined code. It is difficult for cross-functional teams to work with. For example, front-end developers and designers typically don't know Java and they would have to learn a new language.

**Is JSP front-end or backend?** Servlet and JSP are java back-end web development technology. Back-end Development refers to the server-side development.
